



The June 11th (Saturday) Register Guard (Cutting Waste article by Saul Hubbard) and the June 19th (Sunday) Register Guard (Opinion Piece - Rural Garbage: Bite the bullet) gave all of us a rather nasty bit of news. The first article tells us of a report that purposes to cut 8 of the 16 transfer sites in Lane county. Of course the Swisshome site is on the hit list. The research done by a California-based R3 Consulting Group somehow determined this could save tons of money for the county. This move would theoretically save the county \$570,000 a year. By cutting rebates and senior discounts another \$196,000 would be saved. The second report about biting the bullet simple gives the opinion that Lane County can't afford to keep all 16 sites open.

Folks, this is terrible news and in the main is a very bad idea. From Deadwood this could mean over a 60 mile round trip to recycle the Register Guard. If we all drove East this would still be over a 40 mile trip for those who live right in town and by Highway 36. Did I mention that this all boils down to a really terrible plan.

I have sent in an article to the Register Guard (Not printed yet?) which specifically states that for our community this is really unacceptable. The little note also asks for our West Lane Commissioner Jay Bozievich to help us out of this mess.

In the meantime I have called and either spoken to or left messages for Michelle & Richie, Maggie & George, Keith, Mel, Gerry Burnett, Don Wilbur, Alpha by way of mail carrier, The Deadwood Post Office, The Swisshome Postoffice, Greg Lindsay, Rick Barrows, Howard of the Swisshome Heartbeat (article to show in next edition), Pastor Brian Moore (announced in Church and Denny Ellis.

I also had a visit with Paul Harry at the Deadwood, Store -- he was going to tell Herbie about the possible closure of the Swisshome site.

The above articles mention something about 4 meetings in July? Didn't say where? Also a hint that a decision would be made in August, what ever that actually means?

What to do next?

Did I forget to mention that closing the Swisshome Transfer Site is \*really \*really a very bad idea for this community -- it really is!


