Despite the passage of the "Silence the People" bill also known as SB633, Support Local Food Rights will continue our work to put the Local Food System Ordinance of Lane County ballot measure before the voters.

Our ordinance frontally challenges pre-emption and state and federal constitutional laws that elevate the rights of corporations over those of the people. The form that our community rights initiative takes is the only legal approach that challenges the fundamental structure of law that continues to empower corporations to write laws, control our government and silence the people's voices.

We fully anticipate the highest level of push back from corporate interests, but we will persevere because, until we dismantle the systems of laws in this country, we are powerless to reign in the power, money and influence of corporations over our government.

Keeping in mind that the regulatory system is rigged and the government is bought out, we must embolden the people's power at the local level - our constitutional right in every state - to roll back corporate control and exercise our rights to local self-government. It is the people's movements of this country that have truly brought about significant change in our structure of laws, and it can be done again.

Our state is the 10th largest yet only ranks 34th in population.

Our state has over 8000 standing bodies of water and over 55,000 miles of river and streams. If you include small creeks and springs, this number swells to over 100,000 miles.

The Willamette Valley (120 miles long by 40 miles wide) produces more grass seed than the rest of the country combined.

My favorite place in our state, with Crater Lake running a close second, is Hell's Canyon of the Snake River. Few from Western Oregon have seen it. A full third of a mile deeper than the Grand Canyon! 25 plant species on the Canyon floor that are found nowhere else in the country. More to follow on this gem.

Cole Porter started music lessons at age 6, but his best work was in the last 5 years of his life, dying at 64.

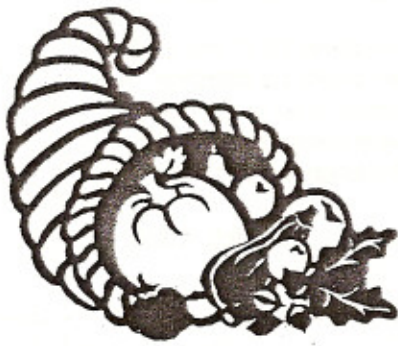
