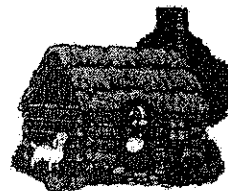

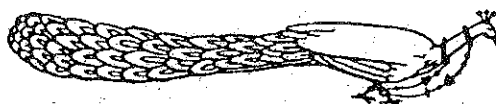

## A Friendly Reminder to Drive Safe in Deadwood.

We have all hurried down the road at some point yet its necessary for all of us to drive safely.

Deadwood Creek Road begins with highway like conditions, for about 5 miles, then it gets narrow with blind corners and cliffs. OK, Time to slow down and stick to my side of the road, even tho it's tempting to drive down the middle of those yellow lines. 2.5 miles later, we hit the gravel; more blind curves, narrow stretches and cliffs, sharp bends. When it's freshly graded the treachery increases with the feeling of driving on marbles. At other times it's full of corrugations or potholes which can bounce you right off the road if going too fast. At these times I call it "Dodg'em Hole Road."

*At all times it is essential for us to drive with courtesy and consideration for other vehicles.* Upper Deadwood Creek Road is narrow and dangerous. We all have to slow down, pull over and ease past each other, or, at times, stop to let the other one thru. Please drive safely for all of our sakes.

On October 6, Lane County Circuit Court Judge Charles Carlson ruled against us and decided that the Local Food System Ordinance of Lane County failed to meet pre-election requirements.

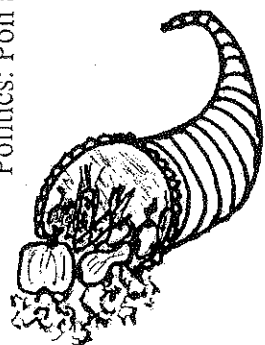
The decision is a victory for the corporations that profit from GMO agriculture in Lane County. It is a setback for local farmers, food-related businesses and residents alike who are personally and economically invested in local agricultural products – both organic and conventional.

However, we are already planning next steps for our efforts to protect the Lane County local food system.

This decision is a roadblock to Lane County residents' access to the initiative system – one in which citizens have the democratic right to write laws. In the absence of a law protecting local farms, corporations like Syngenta and Monsanto will continue to bring more genetically engineered food varieties to the Willamette Valley.

**We remain committed to advocating for a law elevating the community's right to decide what our food system looks like over that claimed by corporate executives.**

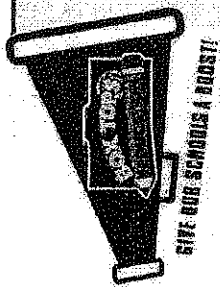
