Re: Steve Causey, aka John Forbis I spoke with Sharon Sweet, as I was curious of Steve's current situation.

A pro-bono lawyer has been acquired to try to get Steve an early medical release from prison. Through our conversation, I was educated to the fact that in the "outside" world the system can drive one "postal". In prison, that bureaucratic frustration can be multiplied by ten and progress on a release can seem slower than a slug in the sunshine. Know that people are working on this and that all of the money that we all have raised is in the bank and when needed will be appropriated to cover necessary expenses.

What you can do:

(1) If you haven't written a letter for Steve, DO! This is important. We are trying to build a portfolio for presentation to the parole board. The letter should say how Steve was an asset to the community, was a hard worker, was helpful, & relied on no one for help himself. Include your signature. If you have a title, i.e. doctor, are a business person, have educational credentials, etc, please note, this will validate your standing and Steve's. If you can say something about who you are in the community and how you know him, this is helpful too. Sign your letter and send it to:

(2) Write a letter to President Obama asking for clemency for John Forbis. As you know some non-violent drug offenders are being granted clemency. Most have long sentences of 15-20 years but Steve is a special case. Mention his age (74) and the fact that he is in a wheelchair and in chronic pain. He also has Polymyalgia Rheumatica, emphysema and COPD. Also he is being held on a charge that, in many states, is no longer a crime. He is not a threat to society and is not a hardened criminal. Send hard copies to one of the two addresses above. They will be comprised and become part of his portfolio.

(3) Write to Steve! He is in a difficult hell. Letters mean a lot to him. He will respond to every one. Steve's prison behavioral rating far exceeds the highest assessment. His address:




Continuing Shiloh's international legacy by welcoming his friends to Oregon and Deadwood.

Nickson Parmisa is the Assistant Chief of the Athi River group of the Maasai people. He is coming to Oregon specifically to attend the Oregon State Univ. commencement on Saturday, June 11th. Shiloh will be awarded a posthumous Doctoral Degree at that time and be honored by the President of the University. Nickson is a specialist in Kenyan wildlife and has been specifically instrumental in recovering lion populations in compatibility with his people's pastoral livestock-raising lifestyle. This is a fascinating subject akin to our own wolf-livestock conflicts here in the US West, and was a primary focus of Shiloh's research. We hope to see you there! This is another in a series of intercultural events presented by the Siuslaw Institute's program to increase international understanding.
