Thanks to everyone who commented on the Lane County Transportation Planning website. The comments on speed limits and bike/pedestrian safety on Highway 36 have been forwarded to Oregon Department of Transportation since they are responsible for the highway. Comments on the need for upgrades to the unpaved parts of Deadwood Creek Road made it to the draft identified needs list but, at this point, are not ranked very high on the draft report. One of the factors leading to the low ranking is that records show there are few accidents on this section of road. Most of us know there are plenty of accidents (usually where someone "falls off" the road) that never get reported. In the future, consider reporting all accidents as this would help bring funding for upgrades.

Where Do We Go When Life Presses Hard?

Eleven years ago I had a large stroke in my cerebellum. One Ear, Nose, and Throat Doctor commented on my stroke: "I've trached people with less damage than that." I was completely unprepared. No precursors, no warning; it was early morning and I was dressed to go running in the hills. After surprise came fear, after fear came more fear, then came my mind running fast, laced with the body's drugs to combat fear and shock. I believed in the first three hours that I was about to die.

Then I remembered my Lord, then I remembered His Words and Promises, and one promise stood out in my mind: "And we know that all things work together for good to those who Love God, to those who are called according to His purpose". Yes, I fit those qualifications; His promise to make even this stroke a good thing all around in my life. I don't have the room to tell you the amazing story, yet as with every Promise He has ever made, this one came to pass: I grew in insight, joy, freedom, and faith as I looked to Him in the aftermath of this stroke. Later I could say I am very grateful for the stroke

Fast forward 11 years to three weeks ago. I am having upper chest pains periodically, and end up having a full stress test evaluation with ultra sound. This leads to a CT scan with contrasting dyes in my veins. This leads to a second CT scan with a barium smoothie and time with a Pulmonologist. During this three week period it was suggested that I may have a bad heart, a tumorous lung cancer, cysts on my lungs, and possible kidney cancer. Where do we go when life presses hard? I currently have two family members battling cancer, and several other dear hearts facing serious diseases, and besides that...

These are the times which test our souls. **These are the times which test the foundation that we've built our lives upon.**

Jesus makes a statement about our foundations: "Whoever comes to Me, and hears My sayings and does them, I will show you whom he is like: He is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently against that house, and could not shake it, for it was founded on the rock. But he who heard and did nothing is like a man who built a house on the earth without a foundation, against which the stream beat vehemently; and immediately it fell. And the ruin of that house was great."

In the end, no bad heart, no lung cancer and no kidney cancer; rather cysts in my lungs (which the Doctor believes I have had since I was a child and was exposed to major second hand smoke), and a hiatal hernia. This is very good news to me, but the great news is that yet again, His Promises are true and the foundations held secure. I walked through this very uncertain time without fear, being present in the journey, and with joy in my days. I am fully persuaded that had the body news been cancer, that His Promises would have held solid, all the way. ----



Historic Event

On Memorial Day, 5/30/2016, the Deadwood Pioneer Cemetery will host our 2nd Pioneer Heritage Day at the Cemetery, approx. 12:00 – 3:00. Free Food will start at noon: we will once again provide drinks, hot dogs and chili, and welcome potluck sides and/or desserts. Come down and hear “Pioneer” actors talk about the times, enjoy some food, and see historic displays and demonstrations. This year we will also honor the first Civil War veteran buried in DPC. Please contact us if you have ideas or want to be involved.



You will also have a chance to give your opinion on the progress at the cemetery, discuss plants and plans, and learn the best ways to clean old headstones and what NOT to do. Of course, you can still visit the graves of your ancestors and place flowers or flags at any time.

Cleanup Day on Saturday, May 14 (the week before Rhody Days), 9 am – 3 or 4 pm, at the Cemetery. Weedeaters, pruning shears, rakes and wheelbarrows are welcome – and don't forget your gloves and drinking water! Trained volunteers to help clean headstones will also be on hand – buckets, gentle soap & soft natural brushes are welcome – NO wire brushes, pocket knives or harsh chemicals, please.

Headstones - we want to know what you know! We have again applied for a grant to buy headstones where they're missing, degrading, etc, and if you know of any graves that are unmarked or poorly marked, please contact us.

There are about 36 graves currently on the list to order headstones; we have about 30 names with unknown locations, about 30 stones/ temporary markers that can't be read, and several places where burials are suspected but no information is known. We have about 225 people whose graves are marked well, including Rollin Belknap who founded Belknap Hot Springs, and Thomas Pope who buried his daughter Cassie there in 1883 – over 130 years ago!



In memory of Shiloh Sundstrom the Siuslaw Watershed Council is bringing back the Salmon Run 5K!




On May 9, Lane County Circuit Court Judge, Charles Carlson, will hear a case that threatens the people's initiative power in Lane County, and ultimately, in Oregon at large.

Corporate interests seek to dramatically restrict the people's law-making authority guaranteed by the Oregon and US Constitutions. Lane County residents want to put an initiative before the voters to recognize our right to local community self-government, free from corporate interference. Before signatures could even be collected, corporate interests filed to prevent voters from having a say about the people's right to make decisions in our own community.

To stop the people's effort to limit corporate power, those corporate interests claim there should be greater barriers to the people's exercise of our initiative process. However, advocates of the Community Rights Movement will argue that the Courts have no power to interfere with the people's right to pass local laws until after the laws have passed. To do otherwise, would significantly weaken the the people's initiative power.

Carlson will make a decision that affects our constitutional right to write and pass laws that will protect residents from corporate harms. We must not sit idly by as the last vestige of our so-called democracy is scrapped at the request of corporate interests.

Please Respond Yes Or No To The Annexation Survey

1. A number of people have not responded, or would prefer to wait until the results of the upcoming school bond vote to respond to my annexation survey. The process to annex into the Swisshome / Deadwood Rural Fire Protection District will take a lot of time and energy on my part. I am happy to do this if it is what my community wants but don't want to waste my time if it is not. Our current system of fundraising has not raised enough funds to do much more than pay for insurance and utilities over the last nine years. That means we struggle to afford basic maintenance and repairs for our equipment, let alone improvements.

Upper Deadwood is part of the ten thousand or so Lane County residents who live without fire protection from a fire district. The other three hundred and fifty thousand or so residents live in a fire protection district and pay for that service with property taxes. Here are some tax rates for rural fire protection districts in Lane County:

Swisshome / Deadwood RFPD - \$2.15 per \$1,000 Mapleton - \$2.09 per \$1,000 Lake Creek RFPD - \$3.08 per \$1,000

Lane Rural Fire and Rescue - \$2.12 per \$1,000 Lorane - \$2.30 per \$1,000 Dexter RFPD - \$1.92 per \$1,000

Lane County FD#1 (Noti, Veneta) - \$1.98 per \$1,000 Lowell - \$2.70 per \$1,000 Goshen RFPD - \$2.22 per \$1,000

McKenzie Fire and Rescue - \$2.07 per \$1,000 Marcola - \$1.91 per \$1,000 Hazeldell (by Oakridge) - \$2.71 per \$1,000

Annexation will happen with a petition, not by a vote on a ballot. I will know if there is enough support to go through with this process before starting the real work **IF** everyone responds to the survey that I will be conducting after May 17th.
