Early morning after seeing Kate et al presentation of Standing Rock slides and vids... Requests are now being taken for the 2017 Native Plant Distribution! The NPD provides free riparian plants to landowners on lakes, creeks and rivers in the Siuslaw Watershed. Each year, the Siuslaw Watershed Council distributes over 10,000 native plants and trees for planting along lake and stream banks throughout the basin. Native plants help improve our water quality by stabilizing banks, filtering pollution from runoff, and providing shade to keep water temperatures cool for aquatic species.
