Based in Eugene, Oregon, Satori Bob is comprised of complex lyrical stories, countless live gigs, and a commitment to space and interaction within the music. Often categorized as Americana, Satori Bob is what happens when Tom Waits meets John Prine at Leonard Cohen's house for a drink.

"Satori Bob is many things, and most recently it is the Satori Bob Large Band. Strong and smooth, professional and energetic, the Large Band is turning heads in the Pacific Northwest and beyond. The band is well suited for large festival stages and house concerts, clubs and special events.

Composer, vocalist, and rhythm guitarist John Baumann is the musical soul at the center of Satori Bob. Satori Bob features a dynamic lineup of excellent musicians who flow in and out of the project. Guitar, bass, violin, banjo, and drums complement John's guitar and voice, framing strong and unforgettable songs in a variety of settings.

We are classified by radio folks as alt-Americana, but we have a unique voice that blends energetic bluegrass styles and gypsy-ish tones and time signatures, open stark ballads and gorgeous instrumental interplay, all serving as the foundation for well-written strongly lyrical compositions. 

Act 14: In a style reminiscent of Spanish guitar, Greg H. ran wonderful guitar riffs.


Act 15: Sunny played three songs he had written on a road trip to Mexico, including my favorite, *Domingo*.

Come join us in the High School Library from 6:00-7:30pm. We are very excited to share with you the improvements we have planned for the Mapleton School District!


Dear Community members;

Please see below the e-mail I sent to ODOT regarding the repeated slides happening this winter near Triangle Lake on Hwy 36. We all know this is a problem area, but seems as if this winter is particularly troublesome.

I was directed to contact the Lane Area Commission on Transportation (Lane ACT). See the e-mail below & you can go to the ODOT specific website to see more about Lane ACT. Maybe if a lot of us e-mail regarding this Hwy 36 issue, ti might help. As we all know, It is well traveled and needs to be safe.

Hi Linda,



Thank you for your note regarding Highway 36 near Triangle Lake. You are right to be concerned about the stability of the slope and asking about long term plans. We are concerned too. Just this weekend crews went through the area seven times to check on the recent landslide areas and have eyes on the entire slope. Rocks and mud on and near the roadway were noted and removed.

I talked with our geotechnical hydrologist this morning and was told that they have been all over the hillside to take a look at what is happening and what to expect. Because of the monsoon type storms we've had since the landslides, some rocks and mud that are coming off of the hillside are expected.

As for long term plans and solutions, at this time there aren't any. The Oregon Coast Range has many unstable areas and they have to be prioritized for long term projects.

For long term projects, your best way to share your concerns is through the Lane Area Commission on Transportation. The Lane ACT determines what roadway projects are needed in Lane County and gives recommendations to the Oregon Transportation Commission. The OTC then selects which projects can be funded and go forward. They are meeting on Wednesday, February 8, to talk about projects and funding for the next two years. The meeting will be at Lane County Public Works, 3040 North Delta Highway, in Eugene. More information on the ACT, and information on Wednesday's meeting is at http://www.oregon.gov/ODOT/COMM/Pages/act_laneCounty.aspx. Some of the page information is out of date, but the basics about how the ACT works are there along with the information on the upcoming meeting.



See above for March order dates.



We have few orders for produce, which means that those who order it don't receive it, because we can't meet the amount needed to buy a case.




