USFS Deadwood Creek Restoration Project Public Meeting

Join us Saturday afternoon, May 4^{th} from 1-2 pm, at the Deadwood Community Center to talk about the Deadwood Creek Restoration Project that is being proposed in the Deadwood Creek area.

The Central Coast Ranger District – Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area (the District) of the Siuslaw National Forest is offering a public meeting to the Deadwood community and all interested parties to discuss the proposed Deadwood Creek Restoration Project (the Project). The Scoping Phase of the Project was initiated by sending out a scoping letter to the public the week of March 10th. Those who were interested in the Project were encouraged to become involved in the planning process by sharing their comments or concerns by April 15th, 2019.

The Project planning team is now in the process of considering these comments, ideas, and concerns received, and refine the proposed action if needed. The planning team will then analyze the effects of the proposed activities and put together a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) document. That draft EA will then be made available to the public for a 30-day comment period, and any comments received may be used to help inform the Decision Notice (DN). However, prior to this, we would like to ensure that interested parties have ample opportunity to review and discuss the proposed actions. As such, we are offering a public meeting on Saturday, May 4th, 2019 at 1:00 pm.

We would also like to make sure that community members are aware of funding opportunities through Wyden Authority that allows restoration and enhancement work on private property. If you have private property and are interested in implementing some of your ideas, or other restoration actions, on your land with federal funding, we would be glad to talk to you about how we may be able to work together.
