How to Recycle Your #2, 4 and 5 Plastics for the Ongoing Lane County Plastics Collection

Lane County Waste Management has partnered with local community collectors throughout the Florence area to collect certain plastics on an ongoing basis. There will be several special community collection events throughout the year as well as weekly collections established by the individual collectors.

The Master Recyclers of Florence want to help educate the community regarding the types of plastics that will be collected and how to clean and sort these plastics. It is very important to have clean products so they can be repurposed properly.

Here are some tips on recycling the #2, 4 and 5 plastics.

The only plastics that will be collected will be clean and dry - # 2 (HDPE), #4 (LDPE) and #5 (PP) bottles, jugs, tubs and lids. Please check the numbers on the products to ensure you have the correct plastics. #2 bottles and #2 tubs need to be sorted separately (they are the only plastic that needs to be handled differently). How do you identify whether it is a bottle or tub? A bottle has a threaded neck and cap. A bottle usually has a center seam across the bottom. Tubs have a center dimple or indentation on the bottom. Please keep these presorted and in separate bags by their number for the collection. Remember, #1 plastic is not being collected. Always check the number.

There are several types of labels that will need to be removed. Some paper or plastic labels will require soaking or applying some cooking oil and letting it sit overnight. There are shrink wrapped labels (Chobani yogurt for example) that need to be removed as well as plastic adhesive labels that peel off. If the container has a "heat stamped" label, those do not need to be removed.

Please remove any plastic or foil film on the top of tubs and jugs.

Remember, if any label is too difficult to remove or cannot be removed, please throw the container in the garbage. When in doubt, just throw it out.

All containers and lids will need to be rinsed completely clean and dried for storage.

Trays that are #1 and #6 are not accepted because they are not the correct plastic for this program. All other trays will be accepted. Please sort them by the appropriate number.

Lane County transfer stations and your garbage haulers collect #2 Opaque (no color, not white) plastic jugs (milk, water, vinegar, etc), so please put them in your co-mingle bin or take them to the transfer station.

These plastics are not part of the collection and the labels do not need to be removed.
