Siuslaw Watershed News

The Forest Service is seeking public input on a proposal to restore parts of the Deadwood Creek and Lake Creek watersheds northeast of Florence, OR. Proposed by the Central Coast Ranger District of the Siuslaw National Forest, the Deadwood Creek Restoration Project aims to restore terrestrial and aquatic habitats. The draft environmental assessment describes the project proposal, a possible alternative, and includes analyses on potential environmental, cultural, and socioeconomic impacts of the proposed actions.

Based on conditions in the project area, the proposal includes, among other actions, noxious weed removal; planting of native species; thinning young, dense, planted forested areas in order to accelerate the development of wildlife habitat as well as to provide commercial timber products; replacing undersized culverts with structures that fish are able to pass through; floodplain reconnection with stream courses; decommissioning old logging roads that are causing resource damage and are no longer needed; and arranging wood and logs in streams to create fish habitat.

“As with all of our projects it’s important that we hear from the public. You’re a crucial part of this process.” said Michele Jones, Central Coast District Ranger.


The complete Environmental Assessment, including project area maps, are available online by clicking the button above or by contacting the Central Coast Ranger District at 541-563-8400. Public comments will help inform the Forest Service’s final decision on the project proposal.

Only those who submit timely, project-specific written comments during the public comment period will be eligible to file an objection to the final decision. The Forest Service will accept comments on this proposal for 30 days following publication of the legal notice which was scheduled to happen last weekend (February 15).

Written comments should be submitted electronically to comments-pacificnorthwest-siuslaw-centralcoast@usda.gov. They can also be mailed to Michele Jones, Central Coast Ranger District, P.O. Box 400, Waldport, OR 97394, or hand delivered to 1130 Forestry Lane, Waldport, OR, during business hours (M-F 8:00am to 4:00pm, excluding legal holidays). Mapleton Pool News

On Thursday, February 27, 2020, representatives of the Siuslaw Regional Aquatic Center attended the Three Rivers Foundation Grant Award Luncheon, held at the Three Rivers Casino Resort. The Foundation was established by the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians as the giving arm of its Three Rivers Casino Resort. Doug Barrett, Foundation Trustee and Tribal Council Member, presented the grant award of \$10,000 to Marilyn Fox, president of the Aquatic Center's Board.

“We are so grateful to the Three Rivers Foundation for this support,” said Fox. “We can’t wait to get the Mapleton pool reopened for our community to use.”

The Siuslaw Aquatic Center’s board members and supporters have been working diligently to reopen the much-loved community center, which is located on the campus of the Mapleton School District. A state grant of \$500,000 was received in August of last year, energizing volunteers to continue their long term efforts to renovate the pool building. On Valentine’s Day, a successful Love Your Pool bingo fundraiser was held at the Lion’s Club in Mapleton.


