Ever watched a good knife thrower...they can do it hanging upside down by one foot or twirling around at high speed. This is ninja stuff. Most of us like to succeed but if one equates success

with a result of natural ability, less will be gained than seeing it as a result of applied effort. Masters do not take a subject to a conceptual end...they are masters because they know there isn't one. The path from aim to end point is in a permanent future.
