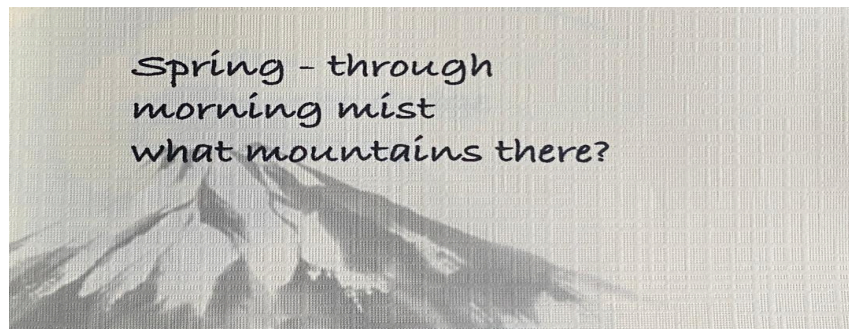

The New Curmudgeon

Oh yeah...I remember!

Ever wonder where imagination comes from...is it manufactured in the brain? Imagination depends largely, if not exclusively, on memory. The hippocampus, which plays a central role in imagination, is also responsible for making memories of what is happening right now, and may also be responsible for making possibilities. There is no way you can imagine anything without the past. Memory itself is a form of imagination. Memories allow us to make predictions. We also need to have memories of our simulations of the future to provide information to draw on when we have an experience. We have "place cells" in the hippocampus that tell us where we are in the world. Their firing rate is called the theta rhythm. This pattern has a cycle of three changes that represent three different parts of our location: where it is, where it was, and a possible upcoming location. There are times when this pattern seems to represent an imaginary experience, a hypothetical possibility. That supports the concept that our imaginings are coming from within and not from external reality. Sometimes this mental replay can include events we have not really experienced. Is this sounding really sketchy...like maybe we "remember" something that never happened? This is a strange reality. The hippocampus can combine past events in new ways, creating something like imagination. This gives the fuzzy concept of imagination a definite root in physical reality. The brain separates fact and fiction by using its own internal models to reconcile information from the external environment. You need, and constantly use, your past memories to make decisions. You cannot do it without them because these models are constructs of past experience as you think you remember it. It's a wonder we're not all psychotic...or maybe we are. We just call it normal. 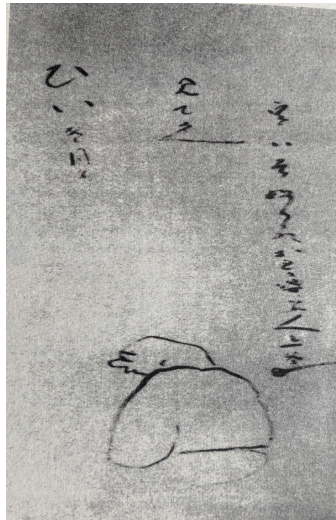

Hello Deadwood!

A few updates from the Deadwood Community Services Board of Directors.

1) Insurance Changes: Our current insurance provider will not be extending our coverage past December of 2024, as they are no longer going to be insuring community centers. We are currently seeking new insurance coverage but have been denied so far; those who have given us specific reasons have stated that the full reliance on a fireplace for heat, coupled with the lack of a sprinkler system and the reality of wildfires, make it difficult to provide coverage at an affordable level.

a) Next Steps:

i) We are applying for grant funding to install a ductless heating system at the Center this year, in hopes to increase our insurability. We have considered options for sprinkler systems that have not been reasonably priced, but are open to ideas if you have information you'd like to share!

ii) Acknowledging that new insurance will be more expensive than our current policy, we are working to identify ways to sustainably increase revenue. We hope to see a continued increase in rentals of the Center and encourage you to share its availability with your social circles. Please consider making a donation to the Center either via our PayPal at www.deadwoodcreekservices.org, at P.O.Box 12, or at a Third Saturday Event, as well!

iii) If you have connections or recommendations for insurance providers, feel free to send them our way!

2) Road Advocacy: The state of our gravel roads this winter was, by many accounts, the worst it has ever been. We are connecting and communicating with County staff to identify opportunities to advocate both for paving of DCR and Upper DCR, as well as replacing the second County grader to ensure all our rural roads are usable in the meantime. Please email us at deadwoodcreekservices@gmail.com to receive updates about opportunities to speak with local elected officials and staff who can move this process forward.

3) Deadwood Summer Camp: We will be applying for grant funding to host a Summer Camp for a week in 2024. We had 16 potential participants express interest from ages 5-17 (12 of whom are 10 or under). We will include requests to provide stipends to some of the older children to assist a paid instructor, and will need additional supervision, financial and food support from the community - thank you for those who have already volunteered!

4) May Day Fun Run and Pancakes! We'll see you on May 5th at 10am at the Community Center for pancakes and the annual run - feel free to bring any plant starts you'd like to trade or sell! Feel free to come early and help Bill C. set up!

5) May Work Day at the Center: We've got a solid list of maintenance needs and wish list items at the Center... Please save the date on May 4th or May 19th (pick one that works best for you) to come and support us with sprucing up our shared space this Spring!

6) Email Communication: We are working on updating our sign-up processes for email updates from DCS. In the meantime, please email us at deadwoodcreekservices@gmail.com if you would like to receive occasional informational updates or event emails related to the Community Center.

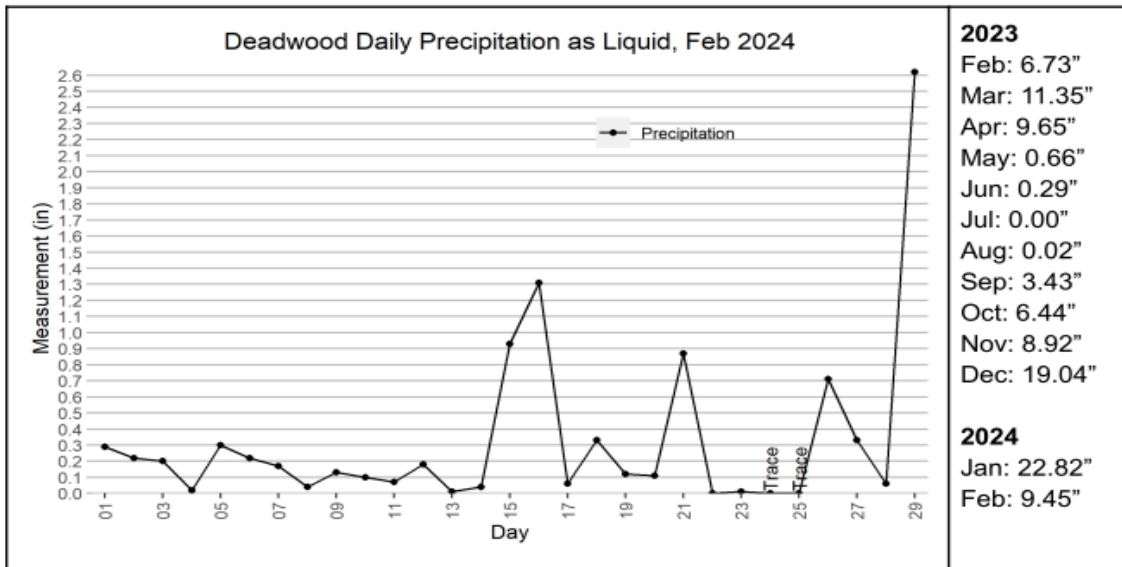
