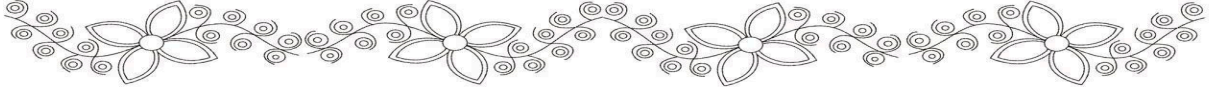

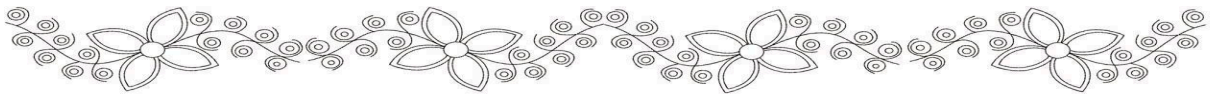

### Speaking Voice Strengthening

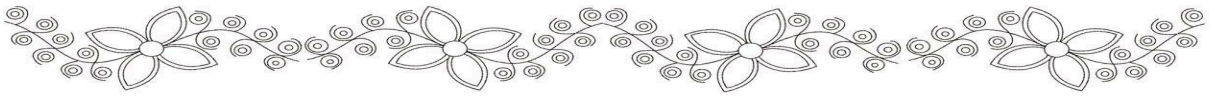
Hey! Want to strengthen and protect your voice? Why not?!?

Local residents are invited to join a group, led by voice training expert, Bex. We will learn techniques and exercises to help increase the volume and improve the quality of our voices.

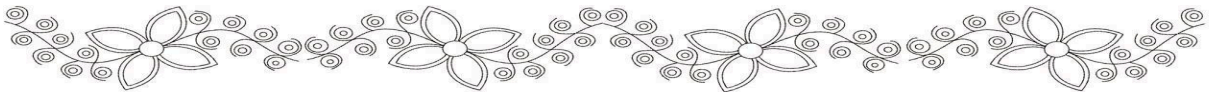

The New Curmudgeon December '25  
Yearendfinds

It is in the dim light of reason that we confront the anxiety of living, negotiating the natural arrangement of time and chance. Language remains the best technology for bridging the abyss between one aliveness and another, searching for a sentence that unlocks a feeling not quite articulated before, an insight that reframes something once taken for granted, a question that has lived for days or weeks, inventing more words to describe the hidden parts of us that we conceal from ourselves and others. The world of facts is populated with inconsistencies. It takes light to make shadows, the strength of each commensurate with that of the other. The deepest strength is often found in the darkest recesses. The hidden needs found in the less explored regions of the psyche require a certain kindness of observation beyond the more common ventures. Abandon judgment and the pretense of knowing the reason or purpose, avoiding attachment to a result or projecting a convenient ending. We never like to see ourselves in the harsh light of another's judgment, although it often illuminates the possible left to rot in a dark corner. The same lessons repeat through different sources and in different guises. All our words need life itself to give them meaning. A language represents a system of knowledge, a repository of specialized understanding. Each language carrying an entire world of human experience and insight. In the world of AI, about 97% of the world's languages are considered "low resource" material. The global history of imperialism and colonialism shapes how knowledge is produced and valued. Colonialism has profoundly disrupted local knowledge systems

and the cultural and intellectual systems on which they are based. AI creates a feedback loop where the dominant ideas are amplified while less used ones fade entirely. Loneliness is being deprived the privacy of your thoughts. Loneliness is constant surveillance.. We have that now big time. We are so vulnerable, not just at a personal but at an international level as the division of power becomes more obvious and peoples are marginalized. Living the enchanted yes of the artist giving way to the preformed and perfumed surface contact. Ninety years of absorbing, observing, of immersing in the world, of witnessing changes beyond belief and now the ultimate collapse as we give over our power to think and create to a robotic process that produces data like it was a bodily function and will mindlessly gobble us up. We will become data for exploitation beyond our powers of comprehension. It's like giving up your humanity, your spiritual being. We will rekindle this small bright fire from the fragments of the possible, blessed with a moment that will never return. The world is not obliged to provide protection against the violence of feelings. No guarantee of security will manifest not of your own making. In the intermission between the clangour of feeling against feeling, there is the deafening silence of time. Acknowledge your own vulnerability and that of your neighbor, expecting none in return...that one is their business. The arc of my life has come to rest now in this beautiful community of caring people. It's miraculous that this can come about in the face of such complexity, on the uncertain ground of existence, precipitous with doubt. Our resistance to change is our self directed instrument of suffering..
