#### Dear Friends:

The shooting incident involving a buck that occurred Friday night, November 8, has been extremely upsetting to everyone within earshot. Moreover, considerable time and energy have been spent in trying to clarify and resolve this issue. As owners of the property where the shooting took place, we are naturally concerned—not merely about the obvious trespass that took place, but more importantly about the potential danger to people and livestock that are regularly present in our pasture, both during daylight hours and in the evening. Violation of the law is one thing; but the larger issue for us is the carelessness and arrogance that leads a person to fire a gun without regard to those living here, including wildlife. This is a community-wide issue, and anyone possessing a gun must know that he or she has a responsibility not to trespass, hunt, or engage in target practice within range of people.

The undersigned neighbors join us in expressing these concerns.

Christmas is celebrated on the 25th of December and commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ. The word Christmas is derived from the Old English word "Cristes maesse" which literally translates to Christ's Mass. Although no one knows for sure the exact date of Christ's birth, the date chosen to celebrate it is related to the Roman Saturnalia festival that lasted from the 17th -21st of December. This date was chosen somewhere during the 4th century AD by the heads of the church. The date became widely accepted by most branches of Christianity with the exception of the Armenians who reserved the 6th of January for Christmas celebrations

During the reformation of the 19th century there was some disfavour with Christmas and its associations with paganism. Many protestants distanced themselves from the tradition. However, by the latter part of the 19th century the celebration of Christmas grew wide spread. It was around this time that the modern Christmas tree was introduced in Britain. The 20th century brought a general acceptance of the tradition despite the criticisms that were originally set against it.


