1983: MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY
Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., the great civil rights movement leader, was assassinated on April 4, 1968. Soon after, campaigns began to create a federal holiday in his honor, including a 6-million-signature petition.

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed a bill making it a federal holiday, beginning in 1986. King's birthday, Jan. 15, was considered too close to the holiday season, so the third Monday was chosen.

The holiday was recognized by all 50 states by 1999.

Dear Neighbors,



Dear Friend of the Siuslaw Watershed Council:

You helped to make 2012 a successful and productive year for watershed health in the Siuslaw Watershed and Coastal Lakes. Your support enabled us to implement restoration, monitor watershed health indicators, generate economic opportunities in our communities, and educate youth and adults. All of our work is made possible through our diverse partnerships.

Here are a few of our accomplishments in 2012:

- Large wood structures were placed in more than **2 miles of stream**, improving aquatic habitat for coho and many other species far into the future

- By removing a failed culvert, we provided **access for the first time in 70 years for steelhead and cutthroat** to spawning habitat in a high priority basin

- More than **150 riparian acres** were planted or maintained by our SWC Restoration Crew, advancing future stream shading, filtering of nutrients, and large wood recruitment

- Over 13,000 native plants were planted by 118 riparian landowner volunteers** along streams and lakes in the Siuslaw Watershed and Coastal Lakes

- We provided experiential watershed health and restoration education to **more than 450 youth** in the SWC Camp and through partnerships with Mapleton, Siuslaw, and other local schools

- 50 stream miles** were surveyed by our SWC Restoration Crew for native river mussels and **12 sampling sites** were monitored monthly by volunteers for nine water quality parameters

- Local contractors and businesses, including tree fallers, heavy equipment operators, surveyors, and nurseries have received business as a result of SWC projects**

Our accomplishments are only possible with grant funding and your membership and donations. Your support is essential to continuing our work in 2013 and beyond.
