DEALING WITH DUST

Lane County will no longer be applying dust control to unpaved roads. SureCrop in Junction City (phone number 541-998-1121) can do this privately. The more area we do, the less the cost is per linear foot. I got a ballpark estimate of \$1500 for a half mile of road. At that rate, 880 feet would be about \$500 and 440 feet would be about \$250. If we got more than half a mile signed up, the price would be lower per foot. If we had less, the price would be more per foot. Is anyone interested?

Other things we can do to reduce dust at no cost are:

- REDUCE SPEED: Speed reduction on gravel roads has been known to reduce up to 65% of dust emissions.
- REDUCE TRAFFIC: Reducing the number of vehicles or limiting the amount of trips in a day can also significantly reduce dust along gravel roads.

A PITHY PITCH ABOUT ENGLISH

blessed one of them is right."

No so, Rudy. They have to be in English. For the purposes of this essay I shall take three classifications of American English that differs somewhat from British English, the mother tongue.

In England a truck is a lorry, a streetcar a tram, a policeman a Bobby because he wears a helmet named for its designer, Bobby Shaftoe, an early Lord Mayor of London. A woman is a Jill, so called for the girl who went up the hill with Jack and took a tumble, not to Jack but down the hill.

In the U.S.A. there are many varieties of English but the three principle ones are formal, informal and vulgate. Vulgate is not vulgar. Here the word means standard or widely used English.

In formal English one might say: I mounted to the terrain's crest to survey the surrounding vista.

In ordinary English the remark becomes: I climbed to the top of the hill better to see the scenery.

In vulgate the remark becomes: I went up to look around.

Language is similar to a musical instrument. You may use it as a fiddle or a violin, as a formal or informal mode of speech.

We children used dog Latin to tell secrets around our parents and to keep them from correcting our grammar.


