

DEADWOOD NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH, JUNE, 2013

One incident was reported in May on Westfork Road:

May 28, ~5:30 p.m. a resident's two, adult Pitt Bull dogs, loose on the road attacked a neighbors dog while it's owner and the leashed dog walked along the side of the road. Community member Robert Muir, driving by and having a baseball bat, drove the Pitt Bulls off the dog held by its owner. Fear was expressed that the Pitt Bulls would turn on the owner. The leashed dog suffered puncture wounds and was later treated by a veterinarian. This was not a first occurrence, and for community safety the Pitt Bulls were euthanized by their owners.




