What was your first impression of the Deadwood valley?


How has this region shaped who you are?

Dear Friends of the Siuslaw Watershed Council:

Thank you for your interest and involvement in the work of the Council. September 17th is the Annual Celebrate Siuslaw Salmon Dinner! This event is the primary fundraiser for the Siuslaw Watershed Council and includes a great dinner, silent and live auctions, short presentation and music. Doors open at 5:30pm at the Florence Event Center and the evening should wrap up by 9pm.

The Siuslaw Watershed Council supports sound economic, social, and environmental uses of natural and human resources in the Siuslaw River Basin. The Council encourages cooperation among public and private entities to promote awareness and understanding of watershed functions by adopting and implementing a total watershed approach to natural resource management and production.

For more than 20 years the Council has been engaging residents, landowners, businesses and other interested parties to help improve and enhance watershed functions across the basin. Much of the work is funded through grants that are awarded by the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board as well as other State and Federal partners and private organizations. Many grantors provide for project specific administration but unfortunately do not provide general business overhead costs, such as pre-project planning & development, accounting and financial management, as well as the host of miscellaneous costs that any business must bear. Donations and income from the Celebrate Salmon fundraiser provide the dollars for these typical and ordinary business costs.

We hope that you make time in your schedule to attend our event. Tickets are available now for the low cost of \$25 each or for \$30 at the door.

The number of tickets will be limited so that we can adequately plan for a bountiful meal so please purchase your tickets early!

Fire Services Annexation Update

The two public hearings for the annexation into the Swisshome-Deadwood RFPD are now on the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) calendar. The first hearing will be on October 17th and is with the Land Management Division before the BCC. At this hearing the Land Management Division will determine:

- 1. If the proposed boundary change is a land use action;
- 2. That all application submittal requirements have been met;
- 3. If the legal description accurately describes the boundaries of the proposed boundary change as it is shown on the cadastral maps;
- 4. If the list of taxlots is accurate and complete; and
- 5. If additional information is needed, and communicate what is needed to the applicant.

The second public hearing will be on October 31st. At this hearing the BCC may approve or disapprove the proposal, considering the following decision criteria when evaluating the proposed boundary change:

- 1. The land is not within a district formed under the same principal act;
- 2. The annexation area can reasonably be served or continue to be served by the facilities or services provided by the district;
- 3. No land included in the annexation area will be removed if the land is benefited; and

4. The boundary change is consistent with the Lane County Rural Comprehensive Plan, other applicable refinement plans, and other adopted land use regulations or agreements as required for the county board to adequately evaluate the proposed change

The BCC, in making their decision, may also modify a proposal to make it larger or smaller. If the BCC accepts the proposal as it is, they will enter an order describing the boundaries of the territory annexed and declare it annexed to the district.

Hearings will be held in Eugene at the Public Services Building (125 E 8th Ave. Eugene). Exact time to be announced.
